Pastor's Message

April 2024

I recently saw this post on Facebook, and it really got my dander up. Can I say that? Here is what it said:

• **Religion:** worships God.

• **Spirituality:** encourages oneness with God.

Religion: God is outside of you.Spirituality: God is within you.

Religion: teaches people to be afraid of hell.

• **Spirituality:** teaches people to create heaven on Earth.

• **Religion:** based on fear and restriction.

• **Spirituality:** based on love and freedom.

• **Religion:** feels like being a single drop in the ocean.

• **Spirituality:** feels like being the entire ocean in a single drop.

• **Religion:** based on others' experience.

Spirituality: based on your personal experience.

The first few comments responding to these bullet points was: **I live spirituality!** (and that got an **AMEN!**)

All I can say is that whoever made this list had a pretty bleak religious upbringing. We live in a very dualistic world and often think it's only one way or another. What about the third way? The paradox? I don't believe you can claim these sharp distinctions of religion and spirituality. Christianity is a religion birthed and nurtured by the power of the Holy Spirit. In reading scripture it's clear that we are created to be in community. Religion can help to gather and send us but our being joined to the Body of Christ is always about the spirit at work in us. So, am I not spiritual? As Lutherans, we often talk about the "already" but "not yet" as in, when God makes a promise you can trust it. We can trust that 'all will be well' even when we don't live in that circumstance immediately. God keeps his promises. That's based on other people's experiences and my own. Scripture has much to tell us about who we are as God's people and who God is.

Yes, I realize that organized religion has done a great deal of damage to folks over the years. I have heard about the hellfire and brimstone sermons that threatened the congregation and manipulated them through fear. As for me, I heard that God desired to claim me as child and wanted me to experience eternal life by following in the way of Jesus. I was taught that Holy Communion was a foretaste of the feast to come – an experience of heavenly welcome and oneness here on earth. I was taught that God was outside of me but also within me through the power of the Holy Spirit and furthermore was within my neighbors and I was to look for Christ in all people. *Jesus loves me, this I know.*

We also went over details of the Covenant of Licensure Approving Synod Authorized Minister, a copy which may be obtained from the church office. Scot B. moved to pay the SAM rate of \$28.00 per hour for all pastoral duties above and beyond the 25 hours a week. Eli R. seconded the motion. MCU.
 - A. Eli R. moved to approved the revised job description and the compensation guidelines of the Covenant of Licensure for the SAM; Scot B. seconded the motion. MCU.
 - B. Brian K. will present the job description and Covenant to the Synod for any final input. Eli R. moved to offer Natalie Hanson the position of SAM; Scot B. seconded the motion. MCU.

Our next meeting will be Sunday, March 17, 2024. There will be an all committee meeting prior to the Trustee meeting.


We will also have installation of trustees and committee members during the church service.
