A note from the virtual pews...

A new year and a new perspective are taking shape as I write this in my son's home in Oak Harbor, Washington. I hear news of bad weather at home – the usual winter storms that come and go – but here on Whidbey Island, the grass is green, and the forest is lush and full of life. It was a dramatic change in scenery as our train went through a dark tunnel for fifteen minutes. On one side, snow covered mountains and landscapes, leafless trees, and winter. On the other side, something completely different - green lush forests. It was a little bit like the Wizard of Oz story going from black and white Kansas to colorful Munchkin land. And while we enjoy these new vistas, we hear news of the tragic fires consuming California and the Los Angeles community. On any given day there are as many perspectives as to how the world looks as there are people.

On January 12<sup>th</sup> at 7 am I tuned into United Lutheran's Facebook page and joined along with some others to worship with ya'll. As various people's names popped up on the screen as watching I felt a sense of community. There were people joining from Arizona, North Dakota, and down the road in Elbow Lake. It was especially heartwarming to have our SAM, Natalie Hanson, greet us directly as she led worship that morning. I so often forget to include those people who are joining us from outside of our worship space. It really does make a difference, when you are directly greeted by someone. You feel part of something bigger. And I really appreciated the folks who signed in with a 'Good Morning' or a comment because it let me know that I wasn't a solitary individual watching but a participant with others. I felt a kinship with those folks in the virtual pews.

As the service progressed, I would occasionally see a heart emoji or a 'thumbs up' float up the screen. When you are physically in the pews you can feel the kinship with others around you but when you are 'watching' from afar, those floating signs remind you of what others are feeling as they hear the music or listen to the sermon or witness a baptism along with the other children in the front pew. I am being gathered into worship with you. Apparently, the Holy Spirit can work from a distance in calling, gathering and enlightening. Why would I expect anything less?
