PASTOR JEAN'S MESSAGE

M&Y 2025

The readings for the 2nd Sunday of Easter in the Revised Common Lectionary (in English, that's the breakdown of all the scriptures read during the worship service throughout the church year over a three year cycle) the same story from John's gospel is chosen. Christians have often referred to it as the "Doubting Thomas" story. You probably know the one I'm talking bout. All the disciples have hidden themselves behind a locked door and Jesus shows up. But Thomas isn't around. Maybe he had an errand to run. Maybe he needed some alone time. For whatever reason, he was not there to see Jesus in the flesh and refuses to believe that Jesus has risen. Maybe he just can't stand the thought of having his heart broken again. Maybe it's a safety mechanism to keep his expectations low so as not to be disappointed. We all have our reasons for doubting. Thomas tells the other disciples, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Well, the very next week Thomas gets that opportunity. Jesus shows up again offering peace to all of his former betrayers. He invites Thomas to poke a finger in his side. We're not sure if Thomas actually takes the Lord up on the offer but we do know he proclaims his faith in his reaction to that invitation. Believing Thomas exclaims, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus responds to Thomas' affirmation of faith by saying, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

Theologian (God thinker), Frederick Buechner, wrote in his book, Wishful Thinking, "Whether your faith is that there is a God or that there is not a God, if you don't have any doubts, you are either kidding yourself or asleep. Doubts are the ants in the pants of faith. They keep it awake and moving."

I think Frederick is on to something. I've had more than a few ants in my pants of faith over the years and that discomfort has ultimately led to greater faith. I do not enjoy the struggle, but it is beneficial. God






Mathews Family Benefit

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Scot B. moved to accept the minutes from the February meeting with typo (year to date) corrected; Tammy N. seconded the motion. MCU

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Karen gave the report. Bills are paid. Sunday offering has improved since we started passing the collection plates again. She added the latest electric bill as she had not received it until after her report was printed. The monthly bills were normal. Karen will give more detailed report at the next meeting when all the Board members are present. The Synod dues are set and may change when our membership is updated – probably paying less. 


